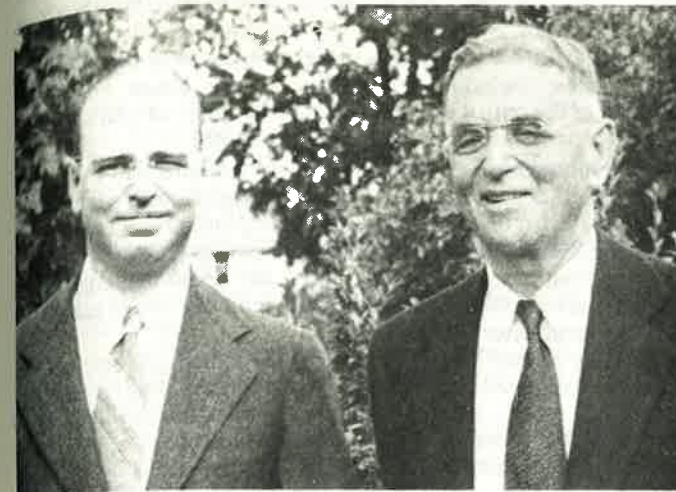

Born at Oshawa, Ontario, April 29, 1865  
1888 — Graduated from University of Iowa Medical School.  
1888 — Practiced at Hillsboro, N. Dak.  
1888 — Arrived in Grafton due to the death of brother Dr. Frank Glaspel, and continued to practice medicine here for 58 years.  
Died on June 27, 1946.

Born in Grafton, N. Dak., March 7, 1893.  
1915 — Graduated from Rush Medical College.  
1918-1973 — Practiced in Grafton.  
1973 — Retired from medicine and relocated in Newport Beach, California; spent 22 months in the service of his country in W. W. I as a surgeon in France.
